

Captain's Note

Esteemed Members,

Welcome to the fourth publication of our newsletter this year.

I have had the privilege to serve as the captain of Royal Nairobi Golf Club in 2023. It would not have been a success without the continued and unwavering support I have received from all of you, coupled with your dedication to the game of golf.

I was well aware of the immense responsibility that came with being captain, and I take pride in the results we have achieved.

Golf course maintenance

Since the start of my tenure, maintaining our golf course has been a top priority in collaboration with the Golf and Course Committee. I wish to express my heartfelt gratitude to our dedicated Green Keeper and the esteemed course committee for their exceptional maintenance and supervision of our course.

The following are the highlights on the course:

- 1. Aeration of the fairways and application organic manure. This keeps the playing surface in excellent shape.
- 2. Improvement of the drainage on various aprons, enhancement of water management, and prevention of waterlogging on aprons.
- 3. We Revamped our irrigation system. By dividing the course into two sections, we can efficiently water all fairways and greens in one day when water supply allows.
- 4. Adjustment of the irrigation on Hole No. 15 for even coverage and replacement of any malfunctioning sprinklers.
- 5. I mprovement of the drainage on the putting green and replacement of the poor-growing areas with sand.
- 6. Our maintenance team refined their techniques, ensuring a tidy course by raking rubbish, clearing dry leaves, and collecting eucalyptus seeds.
- 7. Establishment of drainage systems to capture water from Ngong Road, utilizing both the Rose of Sharon and Jiweke drains. This water is now directed to our Northern and Southern dams located on Holes No. 15 and 16.

I cannot fail to mention the impactful tree-planting initiatives that we have undertaken throughout this year. The commitment and enthusiasm of our members in responding to the call to improve our environment have been truly commendable not forgetting the great turnout during the nationwide tree planting holiday on Monday, 13th November. I extend my gratitude to each and every member who actively participated in this meaningful initiative, showcasing our shared dedication to creating a greener and more sustainable environment.

Competitions

We have had successful tournaments and events that showcased the talent and sportsmanship of our golfers. We have had an increase in the green fee and range practice, as shown below:

Our **golf course income** rose from **Kshs.** 111,453,839 in 2021/2022 to **Kshs.** 117,571,409 in 2022/2023, amounting to a 5% **growth.**

This achievement is a testament to the vibrant and growing community of golf enthusiasts who frequent our facilities. The continued support and engagement of our members and visitors have significantly contributed to this positive financial outcome. As we celebrate this milestone, let us also express our gratitude to all the golfers who have played a key role in fostering the success of our club. Your commitment to the sport and our community is truly appreciated, and we look forward to further enhancing the golfing experience for everyone involved.

Our average attendance for competitions has been commendable with an average of 180 to 200 players per competition to a high of 200 players. The captain's prize 2023 attracted over 400 players over the two days. Indeed, the challenge going forward is hosting competitions and ensuring that every player finishes his/her round and am sure the new Golf committee will be up to the task.

Handicapping

We have managed to align the procedure of issuance handicaps with the KGU handicap management guidelines. Thanks to the Handicap Committee led by Geofrey Rono, Rachel Lofty, and DR JJ Masiga, we have issued 51 handicaps to adult Golfers and 17 junior golfers.

Tannahill Shield (Easter Tournament)

We successfully held the 98th Tannahill Shield (Easter Tournament) from 7th to 9th April, 2023. The juniors' competition was held on 3rd and 4th April 2023, where we emerged in fourth place with a total of 567 points. The seniors' tournament took place on April 7th, 2023, for the second edition of the Senior Tannahill Trophy where we emerged in fourth place with a total of 269 points.

The Royal main team, Team 27, emerged sixth place with a total of 269 points against the other 8 participating teams. Sigona emerged the winner for the 98th Edition of the Tannahill Shield. We knew they were the team to beat after facing them during the Patrons' Cup and the NDC League. I believe that we will regain our shield through our junior program.

As we approach the centenary of the Tannahill Shield in 2025, I extend my encouragement to all golfers to dedicate themselves to honing their skills. Let us collectively strive for excellence and aim to secure victory in the upcoming tournaments, proudly representing our club's legacy in the rich history of the Tannahill Shield.



Royal Junior Academy

A famous African proverb you've most likely heard states, "If you want to go fast, go alone; if you want to go far, go together." That, indeed, has been the story of Royal Junior Academy. In one sense, we've had the largest number of volunteers, and though it feels slow, we have started to see the potential fruits of drawing from a wider pool of volunteers who are vested in the initiative or have skin in the game—a statement made popular by the legendary long-term investor Warren Buffett! Indeed, Junior golf is a long-play initiative, but this should not take away from setting objectives to ensure we are on track, and signs are there to demonstrate that we are.

How can we tell? Well, Cherono Kipkorir and Mwathi Gicheru were called to the 2024 AAJTC National Squad Training that will be the basis of the team selection. This initiative that Junior Golf Foundation intends to run all year through with changes to the team composition as competencies change is an example of the growing transparency in team selection that allows junior players to work at giving themselves a chance to join the national squad. It is a good time to congratulate Fanuel Yebeltal for the Hole in One achievement at Hole No. 13 Muthiga Golf Club with a 7 Iron to 155 Yards. Well done, Fanuel. Golf Tips

How can you prevent golf injuries?

The hazards of the game go beyond sand traps and high rough. Here are some tips for preventing injuries and staying safe on the golf course:

- Use the right equipment:
 - Gloves can make clubs easier to grip and offer protection from blisters.
 - Don't play with clubs that are too long or short for your height. Playing with the wrong size clubs can lead to poor technique, which can cause strains, soreness and muscle pulls.
 - Wear golf shoes with spikes to avoid slipping when you swing. Real golf shoes provide better traction and stability than regular sneakers.
 - Also, make sure the shoes fit well and are flexible, and let the shoes dry off completely between rounds.
- Repeating the wrong technique puts extra strain on the back, wrists, elbows and shoulders. To learn the right technique, take lessons from an experienced coach or trainer. Look for a pro certified by the PGA (Professional Golfers' Association of America).
- Even if you're just hitting some practice balls, stretch first. Focus on the back, legs, elbows and wrists. Also, work up to a full swing. Try hitting shots with wedges and short irons before moving up to irons and drivers that require a full swing.
- The hot sun beating down all day can lead to sunburn and serious skin damage. Bring sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat and protective clothing. Also, make sure you have plenty of water to keep you hydrated.
- Always be aware of your surroundings. Flying golf balls can come from any direction and can cause injuries. If someone yells "fore," cover your face or seek protection behind a cart or tree—a hard, fastmoving golf ball could be headed your way!
- Also, stay clear of other golfers when they are hitting their shots.
 Young, inexperienced golfers must learn to stand back to avoid being hit by a club during a backswing.
- Watch out for lightning. If the lightning alarm goes off when you're
 on the course or if thunder and heavy rain signal that lightning may be
 on the way, head inside—fast!

Keeping Kids on the Course

Golf is a game you never really master.

Missed putts and drives into the woods can be hard on the most seasoned players, but they are particularly tough on kids. In fact, a report by the National Golf Foundation found that, between 2005 and 2008, the number of golfers age 6 to 17 dropped 24 percent, to 2.9 million from 3.8 million. The study cited the intimidating design of many modern courses as the main reason most kids put down their clubs.

In many sports, not just golf, mastering new skills and trying to be perfect can lead to frustration and burnout. About 70 percent of young athletes give up on youth sports by age 13. With pressure from parents, coaches and others, sports stop being fun, and the benefits of physical fitness get lost.

That's a shame, because golf is a game that can be played by children, adolescents, adults and seniors. Instilling a love of the game at a young age could create a commitment to fitness and health that could reap rewards for years and years to come.

The key to keeping kids on the course could be in letting kids play the game free from pressure. Coaches and parents should, of course, teach proper technique, but they should do it in an environment that's encouraging and positive.

Emphasize what's fun about golf not what's frustrating—and you may make a golfer for life.



Projects

The first most logical point to start this last update for 2023 would be to honor the amazing men and women who have dedicated themselves to serve the club over the club calendar year. I have had the honor of standing with accomplished, talented, balanced individuals: Dr. Rachel Njuguna, Qs. Lincoln Ireri, Eng. Kanyua, Pc Darshan Mistry, Cpt Peter Mwangi, Joshua Ichangi, and Arch. OG Wesonga. Indeed, we have achieved much due to your commitment to your club and the use of your competences and personal resources to improve the experience and generate more revenue for the sustainability of the club. The support and engagement of management in Facilities, Procurement, and Finance have been invaluable; thank you.

It would also be important to mention the support of members including former officials who were not part of the committee but volunteered to lend their historical knowledge. Here we would like to single out Arch Kahura, Arch Oscar Ikinu, Qs George Masese, PC Paul Ichangi, Eng. Hesbon Odumbe, Eng. Sheila Mwarangu Eng. James Kigutu who allowed us to draw from their knowledge when we came calling. They did not require a position to serve or come out to the course and willingly allowed that we use them as a sounding board, dispelling some of our thoughts and reinforcing concepts, many of which had been thought of before and needed very little refining. Indeed, we have a rich heritage as a club, and if each year builds on the great past, we have a great chance of coming close to our potential that far surpasses any other club due to the unique endowment of our facility and the richness of our membership mix.

You ask then where are we on the pending projects; on behalf of the committee, I will enumerate briefly on the three main ones:

1.Storm Drains:

Indeed, we have turned Ngong Road into Ngong River, which has fed into our dams approximately 60 million liters of water captured in the short rains. This translates to 300 days of irrigation at 200,000 liters/day. The simple beautification of growing grass continues, which will also help to hold the embank-

ments in place as we ensure the safety at the rear of the dam. Indeed, Tannahill does not need to be the Desert Classic anymore, and indeed, the rains were just in time. God answers prayers.



2.Swimming Pool:

The facility has enjoyed unprecedented patronage, with children and even members making full use of the facility, resulting in added revenues and an alternative that provides for the enjoyment of the club. We recommend that the facility generates decent revenues before any initiatives are made to add to the space; innovative utilization of the space is the low-hanging fruit. One intangible, unquantifiable benefit would be the health benefit to members or gym users utilizing the space that never swam at their club before. The facility seems to be a highlight for newer members, which is an unplanned but welcome benefit of the improvement. Snagging and repairs, too, need to be closed out, which are predicated on regularizing our pending certificate payments. As stated before, the records, tenders, analysis, peer review comments remain available to the members to interrogate the process and use of their valuable resources. Many thanks to the competent consultants that allowed us to complete this project and the goodwill of members and juniors who kept looking over and providing feedback on the developments. 

3.Ladies Changing Room:

Lastly, the Ladies Changing room is 90% complete on the structure work and tiling. Indeed the space is a decent expansion of the previous unit with 12 showers, 7 Water Closets and a markup station. Unfortunately, due to the time of year when the club goes through leadership changes we do have a slight delay in approvals and payments to the contractor and a resultant time delay of about a month when you consider the holiday period. We can confirm that no single payment has been made to this point. The remaining activities are the procurement of the lockers and sanitary fittings. We are deeply apologetic for the current situation but are confident that the impasse will be behind us soon and the works completed. One of the key objectives of the project team on this scheme is to complete the project without variation to the contract amount. We are at a good place to achieve this objective. Dr. Njuguna, thanks for leading us so well on this scheme.
